and then they you know, sorry that they are into Sterling and how they want to if anyone is interested to buy the Sterling it's here and everything is there and, and but pretty much anywhere you go. Everybody's now starting any communities you go to oh really like surrounding communities surrounding communities in Beaufort region. [removed] like in the [removed]. And there's six Inuvialuit communities like classic [removed]. So

And so Internet itself, you know, it's more like my companion. And when the when the pandemic came the COVID-19. So that's what I did, because I was so isolated, couldn't do nothing anymore, can visit people completely. So isolation went into even deeper isolation. So, when I did, I'm going to make use of the Internet itself, to learn. And that's what I did, too. I, I do a lot of study through internet. So, you know, like, even some of the scientific information. Like, you know, most people don't know anything about it. And yeah, one of the things that I tried to do is to learn more of our universal system, like milky way or anywhere that, you know, why exists, there's a big hole, black hole coming, you know, it's so many millions. Right? Yeah, years away yet, and yet have learned a bit about it. Which is not to the, to the capacity that I should be able to learn more. You know, they've been telling us that what what its gonna be like, what are what are the changes gonna be like, and what we are going to experience? And we really know we never question never know, we just listen and, and remember those stories now that it is happening today, that we used to think and say to ourselves to our sisters, I'm come from a big family of sisters. And when we get together, we say that, you know, the parents, our parents, or our parents or grandparents stories, or the things they used to tell us about it is happening to them, how in the world is changing so much, and you know, how much private there is in our country and, and how are the people are trying to escape and, you know, for safety and not only the fire, but also the floodings and how people have no more homes and and then all these things that they knew that's going to happen, we used to wonder ourselves and say they will storage than their words are really have come to today. And it is happening. And we need to talk to our children, or our grandchildren, our great grandchildren. So that when that time comes for them, then it they won't have fear, they know what they have been told, and what's going to be happening, that changes and so that, you know, they know, they too will know how to live through it to survive it. They could I know they're gonna suffer because everything is gonna be so different from living two worlds, the old type and the nomadic way of life, and today's living is so different for them. And I'm happy through our different organizations that sort of get a chance to go out on the land, and learn their culture and their language and, and especially their drum dancing and, and their way of life, like hunting and fishing and, you know, whaling, how to prepare food for long winter months, how to store them. Because today's weather, like for for July alone here, we've had very, very hard days that we've never had before. And then all of a sudden, August come, it's like, we're already going towards and deaf September, it weather just got so cold. And the Western is always been a cold wind, but how the weather changes so fast before your eyes and, you know, then you wonder, no, these were the stories that were kept with and told to us that, you know, we got to prepare, and know what to do and how to survive.

And yet no scientists have revealed anything. So one of the things is about wildlife is that what caribou and show about this time of the year, you know, they usually long time ago, study the caribou. And this is after, after all the plants and food that the caribou eat are in full. Bloom through that. So that's where the information comes in from to them. It's called Mafa, which is a splint of a curable and which is right next to the liver itself. This splint itself it doesn't, it doesn't get any fat. And yet, it grows long or sideways, get wide. So this this, it means two things. One is that when the splint is narrow, and and then they would say, union because it grows about this time of the year. It's about this time of the year that they would look for caribou, bull caribou, and then find out about the how that the splint is there would start eating on the side of a hill like that. And they would eat or call your I don't know what you call it in English, you know, the English? Oh, yeah.

It's a yellowish green, green.

Yeah, and that, that is what they eat. And so on, they eat it then the it produces two things like you mentioned one white and one is skinny. So when is skinny the tell people and find out it's this winter, you're going to feel your breath. In four months down the road, you and Renee figures about four months down the road. And it's really dark and cold and like January. And so it's gonna be cold. And it's gonna be hard for us to be hard to find some good snow for making Anglo. Even for seals himself, you know, the Greenwich know to to make little den for the for the baby ones. So we could hide for everything. And and so that's why they always try to find out about it. And then on the other hand, one is white, that when the splint is white, then it means you're not gonna see your breath. If winter. It's going to be a good winter, you're going to have lots of snow for the winter for igloo. And it's kind of a natural coal. And three will be much easier for everybody. And that means when a splint is white, and that happens, you know, like I mentioned earlier, but four months down the road. And the reason they say that we're in year numbers, something happens. And when something happened like that, and it finally reached here, and so that's what they use that for prediction. And it comes true almost all the time. Yeah, yeah. So that's what I just wanted to express. Because this kind of information that, you know, we can be able to communicate to other communities through internet, because
